  - Enrollment update: 156 students
  - Facilities update:
    - Landscaper Randy Flemings Stevens created a site plan/concept map for school grounds. The colored circle areas represent the areas in need by priority. Red = 1<sup>st</sup> Priority; Orange = 2<sup>nd</sup> Priority; Yellow = 3<sup>rd</sup> Priority and Green = 4<sup>th</sup> Priority.

- Proposition 39 process (HVAC, Solar Panels, etc.) has been submitted to State for Approval. Then we will go out to bid.
- Backpack racks are being considered for each classroom. Facilities Manager Jose Reyes has installed a prototype outside Mrs. Godoski's 5<sup>th</sup> grade classroom.
- The orchard fence will be extended to include 9 fruit trees.
- Recently, the Sonoma-Marin Farm News published a wonderful article in the January 2016 Issue. In addition, the Farm Bureau awarded a grant for our garden in the amount of \$1,000.00.
- Daily Acts has awarded our garden a grant for worm composting which will include lessons for our 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students.

**9. Information/Discussion Items**

9.1 Discussion of Governor's Budget Release and Summary for 2016-17. There is a .47% cost of living increase. The potential State Bond won't impact us. We will need to get rid of any new structural deficits by 2018. The proposed budget would mean additional money per pupil, which would be equivalent to \$30,000.00 for Two Rock Union School if the budget is adopted.

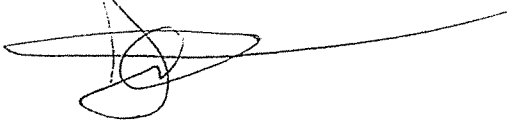
Dear Ms. Beal,

Technology Committee Meeting  
Revision to 3-year technology plan  
Monday, February 1, 2016

Present: Perry Gray, Jan Brogan, Brian Dooley, Dane Lancaster, Toni Beal, Mary Schafer

Committee discussed the current state of technology at the school. At their meeting in the fall, the Board approved \$32,000 of one-time funds for technology (computer) purchases to achieve our goal of 1:1 devices in 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> and 2:1 devices in K-2. Since that time, we received a PEF grant for \$14,200 and purchased 60 Chromebooks. Chromebooks have now been deployed to the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade classroom. All 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade students now have 1:1 Chromebooks. We have set aside 2-3 additional Chromebooks for possible new students for this year. This leaves approximately 32 Chromebooks that can be used for ELD, Special education and the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade classroom next year.

In terms of the budget, the one time set aside money for technology will need to be discussed and likely reallocated to accommodate this year's teacher retirement incentive. Based on the results of the Microsoft settlement program, we will need to cover several software expenses that they did not cover. We have not yet been reimbursed for the Chromebook expenses. Toni will contact PEF to determine when we can submit the invoice to be reimbursed. The current technology budget (outside of one time funds) pays for Brian's and Dane's salaries. It also paid for the Kindergarten tablets. Remaining funds are allocated to instructional materials (\$300) and repairs (\$500).

We then discussed inventory and current needs:

- Apple TVs – All classrooms have Apple TVs installed except for Kindergarten. We have 2 additional Apple TVs that can be installed in the Kindergarten classroom and in Room 11 (or another room if needed).
- Projectors – All classrooms have working projectors. We are in need of projector replacements. Cost of projectors is approximately \$450.
- Document Cameras – We currently have enough document cameras for all classrooms. We are in need of replacements should any document cameras fail. Replacement cost of document camera is \$150.
- Printers – All teachers and staff have access to printers and all are currently working. We need to budget for replacement printers. (\$100)
- Common devices for K-1 - Committee discussed the need to have a standard for common devices in K-1, since beginning next year, grades 2<sup>nd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> will have 1:1 Chromebook devices. Committee agreed that it makes sense to

provide 1<sup>st</sup> grade with tablets (@\$150) like the ones purchased for Kindergarten and deploy the current iPads for teacher and school use.

- Teacher standard equipment - Committee talked about the need to have a standard for what each teacher on staff will have in their classroom: Macbook, Printer, Document Camera, Projector, Apple TV, iPad and Hapara application.
- Multi-Use room system - Committee also discussed the need for a comprehensive system for the Multi-use room that includes a projector, large screen, cover for windows, sound system and stage lighting. This purchase will need to be the focus of an upcoming grant, perhaps from Petaluma Education Foundation next year.
- School Security system - The committee then talked about the need for a security system for the school. This purchase is a priority for the School Board and could be covered by facility funds. Brian will continue to research options that will include flexibility to utilize the cameras for instructional purposes. Brian will bring a proposal for a system within the next month to be presented to the Board for approval.

There was a conversation about the Direct TV system that is at the school, but not being used due to updated equipment. Committee did not make a decision on the status of this system.

Lastly, we discussed the surplus equipment that exists on the campus. The decision of the committee was to wait until the current e-waste drive for TRSEF is concluded and recycle the district computer equipment so that the funds return directly to the technology fund.

## LABOR AND MATERIAL JOB COST ESTIMATE

We are pleased to submit for your consideration our Job Cost Estimates for labor and materials for landscaping at the entrance to Two Rock Elementary School. Labor to be billed at \$50/hour, materials at cost.

I've divided the project into three parts: The gardens at the entrance to the school around the office, the border between the parking lot and the playground, and the area around the ADA ramp.

### GARDENS AT THE ENTRANCE AND AROUND THE OFFICE

1)	DEMOLITION	Remove all of the unwanted plant material, old irrigation systems and other debris.	3,000
2)	SOIL PREPARATION	Thoroughly mix compost into all of the areas to be planted.	2,500
3)	BOULDERS (optional)	Move the existing rocks and add another dozen big boulders	3,000
4)	PLANTING	Trees, shrubs, grasses and groundcover planted in gopher cages. Fertilized and staked as needed. Cost depends on size and type of material chosen.	4,000 to 6,000
5)	IRRIGATION	Drip irrigation systems with a computer, automatic valves, distribution lines, and appropriate drip emitters at each plant. Cost depends on the condition of the existing system.	2,500 to 4,500
6)	MULCH	Cover all of the planted areas with mulch.	2,000
