Background: The Second Interim Report is the second of two interim budget reports required by AB 1200, which was passed into law in 1991 and became effective on January 1,

1992. AB 1200 was enacted to establish a process of fiscal monitoring to ensure fiscal solvency for school districts and county offices. Districts are required by Education Code 42130 to submit a report on their financial status as of January 31. The purpose of this report is to provide the Board and COE with an update on the financial position of the District as of January 31 st and to determine an appropriate certification to the State of California regarding the District's ability to meet its financial obligations for the current and two subsequent fiscal years. The Sonoma County Office of Education is responsible for either accepting or changing the District's certification (positive, qualified or negative). Once the County Office completes their review, they forward to the California Department of Ed., a report confirming the certification of each District in the county.

In addition, the Working Budget for all funds is monitored on a regular basis and adjusted for any new or additional information that becomes available. Budget revisions are taken to the Board of Trustees on a regular basis for review and approval. Included in the attached budget assumptions are details on some of the significant changes between Budget Revision #2 and Budget Revision #3. In addition, they include detailed assumptions for the Multi-Year Projections for the General Fund.

In accordance with Education Code Section 42131, a review of Teo Rock Union School District's (District) Second Interim Report for Fiscal Year 2023-24 has been completed by the Sonoma County Office of Education (County). The District self-certified its 2023-24 Second Interim Report as Positive. After a review of the financial data provided by the District, it appears that the District will meet its financial obligations for the current and two subsequent years. Therefore, the County concurs with the District's positive certification.

State Budget

On January 10, 2024, the Governor released the proposed State Budget for the upcoming 2024-2025 fiscal year. Governor Newsom's State Budget proposal acknowledged California's weakening economy with solutions that did not include deficits and cuts to education. However, the Budget proposal included an element of risk and uncertainty by withdrawing \$5.7 billion from the Public School System Stabilization Account (PSSSA) to support the 2023-24 and 2024-25 Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funding. Additionally, as a result of the slowing of state revenues, the Governor's Budget proposals excluded any new proposals of one-time funds, a departure from what local education agencies have received throughout the last several years, and as expected, included a decreased statutory cost-of-living-adjustments for the 2024-25 and 2025-26 fiscal years.

Given the evolving economic conditions, the state revenues will be closely monitored in the months leading up to the enactment of the 2024-25 State Budget. Anticipating changes, the County emphasizes the need for local education agencies (LEAs) to develop budget solutions to address revenue shortfalls and ensure that the minimum state reserve requirement is met in both the current and subsequent fiscal years. This reminder underscores the importance to think long-term when making decisions.

Second Interim and Multi-Year Projection (MYP)

The District's Second Interim Report MYP projects <u>unrestricted deficit spending</u> of -\$40,347, -\$122,280, and -\$91,790 in 2023-24, 2024-25, and 2025-26, with the State minimum reserve for economic uncertainty of 5% met in all years. Deficit spending is of concern to the County and the elimination of structural deficit spending is critical in order to maintain <u>required</u> reserve levels. Therefore, we urge the District to review and monitor revenues and expenditures, embrace best practices, and budget to live within its means.

The Superintendent/Principal or designee shall not approve such a request if the student would be attending less than one-half of the daily program hours.

6. Admissions

- a. Every student attending the district school is eligible to participate in the program, subject to program capacity. (Education Code 8482.6)
- b. If the number of students wishing to participate in the program exceeds program capacity, students shall be selected for enrollment based on the following guidelines:
- (1) Priority for enrollment of middle or junior high school students shall be given to students who attend daily. (Education Code 8483, 8483.1)
- (2) Priority for enrollment shall be given to students identified as in need of academic remediation or support in accordance with Board policy or administrative regulations.

- (3) Any remaining capacity shall be filled by students selected at random.
- (4) A waiting list shall be established to accommodate additional students if space becomes available.

Volunteers

The Superintendent/Principal or designee may establish a registry of volunteer after-school physical recreation instructors and other before- and after-school program volunteers. (Education Code 35021.3)

To be included in the registry, a volunteer shall submit to a criminal background check pursuant to Education Code 45125. He/she also shall submit current contact information to the district and shall update that information whenever the information changes. (Education Code 35021.3)

The Superintendent/Principal or designee may use a volunteer registered with the district or may select another person to provide physical recreation to students after school hours or to provide other services. (Education Code 35021.3)

A copy of the independent study plan, and if applicable, the state or local public health or public safety order that required school closure shall accompany the Form J-13A submitted to the California Department of Education.

EDUCATION CODE

Section 44977

44977. (a) During each school year, when a person employed in a position requiring certification qualifications has exhausted all available sick leave, including all accumulated sick leave, and continues to be absent from his or her duties on account of illness or accident for an additional period of five school months, whether or not the absence arises out of or in the course of the employment of the employee, the amount deducted from the salary due him or her for any of the additional five months in which the absence occurs shall not exceed the sum that is actually paid a substitute employee employed to fill his or her position during his or her absence or, if no substitute employee was employed, the amount that would have been paid to the substitute had he or she been employed. The school district shall make every reasonable effort to secure the services of a substitute employee.

- (b) For purposes of subdivision (a):
- The sick leave, including accumulated sick leave, and the five-month period shall run consecutively.
- (2) An employee shall not be provided more than one five-month period per illness or accident. However, if a school year terminates before the five-month period is exhausted, the employee may take the balance of the five-month period in a subsequent school year.
- (c) The governing board of every school district shall adopt a salary schedule for substitute employees. The salary schedule shall indicate a salary for a substitute for all categories or classes of certificated employees of the district.
- (d) Excepting in a district the governing board of which has adopted a salary schedule for substitute employees of the district, the amount paid the substitute employee during any month shall be less than the salary due the employee absent from his or her duties.
- (e) When a person employed in a position requiring certification qualifications is absent from his or her duties on account of illness for a period of more than five school months, or when a person is absent from his or her duties for a cause other than illness, the amount deducted from the salary due him or her for the month in which the absence occurs shall be determined according to the rules and regulations established by the governing board of the district. The rules and regulations shall not conflict with rules and regulations of the State Board of Education.
- (f) Nothing in this section shall be construed so as to deprive any district, city, or city and county of the right to make any reasonable rule for the regulation of accident or sick leave or cumulative accident or sick leave without loss of salary for persons acquiring certification qualifications.

(g) This section shall be applicable whether or not the absence from duty is by reason of a leave of absence granted by the governing board of the employing district.
